a- Vocabulary

Clever: SMART / Intelligent

To be bright: To be brilliant.

To be skilled (in doing jobs) = To have capacities and qualifications to do jobs.

To be strong = To have physical force

To win a scholarship = To obtain some money from the government for your studies.

B- Language function: Making comparisons

- Comparative of superiority
- ➤ Short adjective: Structure: subject + verb+ adjective +-er + object Example: In my opinion, some girls are brighter than some boys.
- Long adjective: Structure: Subject + verb + more + adjective + than + object.

Example: I think some girls are **more** successful **than** boys.

• Comparative of equality

Structure: Subject + verb + **as** + **adjective** + **as** + object

Examples:

For me, girls are as skilled as boys.

In my opinion, girls are as intelligent as boys.
