<u>TEXT</u>

Although modern technology has profoundly transformed agriculture, the weather remains the dominant factor affecting year-toyear variations in food output. For most of the past quarter-century, substantial food reserves have been kept against the changes of climate. Those supplies are now depleted, however. Weather may replace pollution as the principal concern of people studying environmental conditions.

The most important weather factor affecting crops is the level of rainfall. Others are humidity, temperature, and lack of direct sunshine.



Usually it is a deficiency of rain that reduces output, although too much rain or poorly timed rain causes crop losses as well.

Unseasonably wet conditions at planting time may be followed by several weeks of drought in midsummer. This leads to total corn crop failures in some areas. Then in the fall, early frosts may cause damage and in some cases destroy both the corn and the soybean crops.
