Cities also provide many opportunities for amusement and recreation. In every city, we can find several cinemas and multiplexes where we can have fun. These arrangements do not exist in villages.

Village life is extremely healthy due to the fresh air. Also, food in the village is healthy and natural. In villages, life is very cheap. People do not have to live with a lot of money. Living a simple life, like in a village, is almost impossible in the city. In addition, villages are not overcrowded and it is very easy for people to get accommodation. People in the village have much sympathy for one another. The sympathy and close interdependence that is marked in village life is entirely lacking in the city.
