PART ONE READING COMPREHENSION (8 points)

Read the text below and do all the activities that follow it.

ROAD PEOPLE

A new race of adventurers is appearing in Ghana. They can adequately be described as road people. These people are moving out into the unknown. Most of them are school dropouts with no job qualifications; that makes them believe they have no future in Ghana. They have no money, no valid travel documents, but they manage to walk across frontiers.
5 They are about two thousand (2,000) in Mauritania.

They said that they started their journey from Ghana to Burkina Faso by road. There, they accumulated some money to go to Mali. Then, they moved to Senegal and finally settled in Mauritania, from where they would eventually travel out to Europe or to the United States. The realisation of this dream depends on the money they can get to buy their
10 passages either by car, boat or plane. Some courageous ones hide away on boats from where they can be thrown into the sea.

But they rarely succeed. They become refugees fighting for survival. They said they were not prepared to go back home empty-handed, which would be humiliating. They do not even send messages to relatives at home. Since their relatives at home do not know the
15 difficulties they have, road people continue to flow into Mauritania from Ghana.
