Asemasa is a small village of only thirty-five houses. It is situated at the foot of a hill which is about 1,000 metres above sea level.

The village is divided into three parts, the biggest of which is the section towards the hill. Because of the location of the village, on a major road, and because it is very close to the regional capital, it attracts many visitors.

The inhabitants, numbering between 400 and 500 are mostly famers. They grow crops such us yam, cassava, plantain, maize and cocoyam. In addition, many other vegetables are grown, especially by the women. Okra and tomatoes are produced in large quantities.

The vegetation is mainly grass but the upper parts of the hill are thickly forested. Charcoal making is another important occupation in the village. This has resulted in the cutting down of a large number of trees, sometimes including such important trees as Shea-nut and *Dawadawa*.

Through their own efforts the people have built a clinic and a post office. There is also a police station which serves the district. There is a primary school and a junior secondary school. Both can be found at the lower part of the village along the main road.
