M&S confirmed last week that it was looking for a man of international calibre who can bring something new to the operation. But it said there were several names in the frame.

It is believed, however, that there is no one strong enough to challenge Vandeveld. And observers agree that M&S needs to announce its new chairman before it reveals what are expected to be poor Christmas trading figures.
